
# **Kimberley Tours**

The Kimberley has two distinct seasons, **the dry and the wet**. During the dry, which runs from May until October, the weather is warm and comfortable. The wet, which runs from November until April, is characterised by heavy and short downpours in the afternoon or early evening which provide a refreshing change after a hot day.

The best way to see the beautiful Kimberley is on a **private, small-group luxury 4WD** accommodated or camping tour or private charter tour. Fully accommodated or camping — it's your choice. Our <u>seven</u>, <u>eight</u> and thirteen day Kimberley Top End Traverse tours travel between Darwin and Broome or Darwin and Kununurra Broome and Kununurra (both directions) and are uniquely able to show you the real,

magnificent Kimberley, much of which was formed 350 million years ago.


The Kimberley is one of Australia's last frontiers and one of the world's last great wilderness areas. It's certainly big. There are over 400,000 square metres of land to explore, making the region a sixth of Western Australia, or the size of California!

With a population of only 30,000, the Kimberley region is truly a rare and unique area – a last frontier of world.

With only one sealed road through the entire region it's definitely uncluttered by tourists, but still very much open and accessible to adventure lovers, particularly when you have our experienced, Kimberley loving tour guides to see you through.

Highlights of our Kimberley tours include the beautiful pearling town of Broome and the world-famous Cable Beach with its turquoise waters, and the remote Gibb River Rd can give you a feel for the Aboriginal and pastoral history of the Kimberley, and take you to spectacular inland river gorges that were formed over millions of years by the forces of nature, such as the Manning and Galvans gorges. Use a rope to swing into a rockpool, let a waterfall massage your back, or just relax in the peace and quiet.

The tiger-striped, sandstone domes of the Bungle Bungles are wonderful to see by air, but getting closer to them by 4WD is a completely different experience – we do both. We visit the Kimberley towns of Katherine and Kununurra; the cattle station and wilderness resort of El Questro; Zebedee Hot Springs; the Drysdale River Homestead; the stunning Mitchell Falls with its spectacular rock art; and one of Australia's largest non-government protected areas, and a hotspot for birdwatchers, Mornington Wilderness Sanctuary, operated by <u>Australian Wildlife Conservancy</u>.

And a visit to the Kimberley wouldn't be complete without discovering the rich Aboriginal history of the Great North West and actually meeting some of its indigenous inhabitants. We visit with Aboriginal artists and elders and see **Wandjina and Bradshaw rock art sites**. The elegant and sophisticated paintings known as the Bradshaws, or Gwion Gwion, are claimed to be the world's oldest figurative paintings.


# **Kakadu Tours**

Kakadu is one of very few places World Heritage listed for both its cultural and its natural values.

It is jointly managed by the Kakadu traditional owners, Bininj / Mungguy, and the National Parks.

Our tours of Kakadu National Park is a unique blend of landscape and culture and we make sure that you have enough time to take the beauty in. We believe in order to fully appreciate the scenery you need to understand the history of Kakadu and that must come from the traditional owners of Kakadu.




Map of Kakadu National Park & region - Northern Territory

Our tour from <u>Alice Springs to Kakadu and Darwin</u> (link), will allow you 2 full days exploring the wonders of the World Heritage Listed Kakadu National Park. Here you will swim at Edith Falls and stay at the Cooinda Lodge Resort. Kakadu is famous for its wildlife and you will have an opportunity view birdlife and crocodiles with a cruise on the Yellow Waters.

Breathtakingly beautiful, Kakadu has its dangers too. Travelling with experienced tour guides in a small group ensures that you will get to see first hand the well known and less well known features of Kakadu and not have to worry about the risks of this wild country.

Our Kakadu tours are always for **smaller groups**, (usually 4-6 people per vehicle) which allows **greater flexibility and personalization** of your experience. We can also cater a specific tour for a small group to allow you to experience the wonders of Kakadu for an extended period or as part of another tour.

We visit the **Kakadu Aboriginal Cultural Centre** and take in the art at **Nourlangie Rock** & **Ubirr Rock** - These amazing sites allow you to get a better understanding of the traditional owners and their beliefs about the land.

The traditional owners of the Kakadu region recognize 6 different seasons where there are changes to the landscape and weather. It is an indication of the close ties the Aboriginal people has with this land that they have 6 seasons where the western cultures only have 2 for Kakadu and other tropical regions.

# **Uluru / Ayers Rock Tours**

Uluru, also known as Ayers Rock, lies 450km South West of Alice Springs. It is 348 metres (1,140 feet) high and 9.4km (5.8 miles) in circumference. It is one of the most recognizable images in Australia and has been used for many years as part of global tourism campaigns due to its unique appearance and link to Australian culture.





We run Uluru Tours of different duration and are flexible in our arrangements to ensure you get as much as possible from your outback tour. All of our tours are in luxury 4WD vehicles such as Toyota Landcruiser or similar. This gives you the advantage of being in a smaller vehicle rather than a bus and the flexibility that you get with being with a smaller group. Usually we travel in a convoy of 2 or 3 vehicles and all of your needs are catered for.

We have, at Spirit Safari, a close link with the traditional owners of the land and we include a strong cultural component to our Uluru Tours where you will meet elders to hear their stories and understand their folklore; you will meet Aboriginal artists and have the opportunity to buy art and experience the sacred sites and feel the power and energy of this unique region.


In addition to seeing Uluru itself, your Uluru Tour includes visits to **Kings Canyon, Stanley Chasm, Mereenie Loop and Glen Helen Gorge**. The time at Kings Canyon includes a walk around the canyon rim and through the "Garden of Eden", or if you prefer the easier and shorter valley walk.

The Uluru tour can include resort accommodation at Uluru so you can unwind after the tour. All food, transport and accommodation is included so you don't need to worry about a thing.

#### **Broome to Alice Springs (or Reverse)**

via Tanami Track - includes Outback Art, Wolfe Creek Crater, Yuendumu, Balgo Art Community Arrive a day or 2 day prior for optional day trips - see Broome Tours

Day 1 - We meet incoming travellers and arrange transport to your accommodation. Today is a free day to relax or take advantagge of the many day or part day tour options available. In Broome enjoy a Cable Beach swim or other activities. Overnight city of departure - Broome or Alice Springs LD

Day 2 - We depart Broome after the arrival of flights to meet incoming travellers (approx. 1pm after lunch). If you arrive this morning earlier, enjoy a free morning in Broome for Cable Beach swim or other activities. We will pickup from your hotel or airport as confirmed. We then travel through sweeping Kimberley grasslands and cattle country to cross the flood plains of the Fitzroy River. We stop by roadhouses, and enjoy an afternoon cup of tea under a majestic boab tree. We start to experience some of the local lifestyles, and sense the spirit of this wide open county as we witness stunning mesa landscapes (great photo opportunities). Late afternoon sees us check in at our accommodation at Fitzroy Crossing before a relaxing night and tasty evening meal, with a chance to meet some of the locals. D

Day 3 - After breakfast enjoy a relaxing Geike Gorge river cruise on the vast Fitzroy River, and marvel at the high cliffs, annual flood records, stunning wildlife and river tales from our knowledgeable local guide. After a morning cuppa, and comfortable highway cruising we enjoy lunch at a spectacular local lookout, on the major songline that crosses the Tanami. Time permitting we stop in at Yiyili Aboriginal Art centre (beautiful colourful & contemporary artworks for sale here) and Halls Creek for last supplies before the Tanami Track. Late afternoon we arrive at Wolfe Creek Crater in time for a crater walk and set up camp prior to a spectacular Kimberley sunset in the desert. BLD

Day 4 - A chance this morning for stunning photos and memories at sunrise of Wolfe Creek Crater, the worlds second largest meteorite crater. Local stories say this is where the rainbow serpent entered the Earth. You can take a walk in the crater or enjoy the view from the crater rim. After a healthy breakfast we take the Tanami Track to Billiluna Aboriginal community on the edge of the Canning Stock Route, before visiting the Balgo Art centre for some wonderful unique art styles and bargains from the local artists. late afternoon we arrive at Rabbit Flat for a welcome shower and overnight camp in the real no-where. BLD

Day 5 - Travel today takes us by the by the great Tanami and Granites gold mines, and old abandoned wells from gold rush & cattle droving days. These are some of the remotest parts of Australia - a great place to reflect on our existence and experience the vastness and vitality of life - even in the desert. After lunch at Rena Springs we're ready for more art bargains from the Warlukurlangu artists at Yuendumu, and a look around at this large and unique outback community. Travel on to Tillmouth Wells for a welcome shower and restful overnight camp. BLD

Day 6 - An easy start to the morning allows us to reflect on our experience at our oasis on the desert. A wide range of well priced art is available here from surrounding communities including Mt Allan, Papunya, Yuendumu. We may even meet some of the artists with their special offers. Late morning we head for Alice Springs, arriving in the afternoon in time to see the sights of Alice. Overnight Alice Springs BLD

Day 7 - Now in the big smoke, you can explore the Araluen Art centre or other fabulous galleries of Alice Springs, or other sites such as Royal Flying Doctor Service, School of the Air, historic Overland Telegraph Station, all with the backdrop of the mighty MacDonnell Ranges - or just soak up this special atmosphere.

Day 8 - Tour ends after breakfast in time for lunchtime flights or more time to relax or explore the many local sites.

Westbound - Alice Springs to Broome - Reverse of Eastbound above with 1st night in Alice Springs or 7 day tour option departs Mondays approx. 1 pm after lunchtime flight arrivals.



# **MacDonnell Ranges**

The MacDonnell Ranges are nearly 650km long and run east and west of Alice Springs. They are the second longest and highest mountain range in Australia and have some of the most spectacular scenery in the country. The MacDonnell Ranges are home to fantastic bush walks and spectacular gorges where you can experience the energy and scenery of this unique region.

To the west of Alice Springs are many gorges and waterholes where you can swim and explore. The popular Larapinta trail runs for 200km through the western arm of the MacDonnell Ranges.

The eastern arm of the MacDonnell Ranges is home to fine examples of Aboriginal rock art which your tour guide will be happy to show and explain. It is only a one hour drive from Alice Springs so definitely a worthwhile trip.



The famous Aboriginal painter, Albert Namatjira captured the beauty of the MacDonnell Ranges in a number of his paintings. The red sandstone, the river gums and the gorges were obviously a great inspiration.

For your tour of the MacDonnell Ranges you will travel in a luxury 4WD such as a Toyota Landcruiser or similar. This provides you with a better experience than the larger bus tours and provides the additional flexibility of travelling with a smaller group.

Our tours that take in the MacDonnell Ranges also include other sites such as Uluru and Kings Canyon. We can even design a tour for your group so you can see exactly what you want. We have a 20 year relationship with the traditional owners of this land which allows us to provide an indigenous cultural component to the trip that other operators are not able to. Our goal in your visit to the MacDonnell Ranges is to not only be amazed by the beauty of the landscape but to inform you of the people and their spiritual connection to the land.

# Cape York, Thursday Island, Weipa, Daintree, Quinkan Rock Art, Cairns Tour

#### **Cape York Tour details**

Day 1 - (Sunday August 5, 2012) - Depart Cairns 8am and travel through the rainforests and the Atherton Tablelands via picturesque Kuranda and Mareeba via the Palmer River area famous in the gold rush days, to the Laura Dance Festival site. Here we set up camp (or accommodation if pre-booked), and enjoy lunch and the festival atmosphere. You can choose to spend the day here, or travel the short distance to the Quinkan Rock Art Reserve, and an afternoon tour of this amazing rock art site. Overnight Laura BLD

Rock Art Walks - Explore the *Quinkan rock art* at the Split Rock art site or the **Quinkan rock art** at Jowalbinna is Queensland's premier rock art site and includes -

- Giant Wallaroo "The Cycle of Birth and Death": Spectacular landscapes and paintings on a walk into Pine Tree Creek valley and up to the opposite escarpment wall.
- The Brady Creek Escarpment "Many Clans, Many Totems": Includes Death Adder, Honeymoon Cave, Red Lady, Garfish Sorcery and Tent Shelter rock art sites, near refreshing Brady Creek.
- Emu Dreaming "The Emu Ancestor enters the Land": An accessible site featuring ancient abstract engravings and occupation evidence.
- Yam Dreaming "The Archaeologists' Choice": A fascinating archaeological dig site on fertility
  ceremonial grounds, involving a challenging walk and climb into the site (available for exclusive touring
  only).

Day 2 - Depart up the Peninsular Development Road for the Old Telegraph Track (OTT) heading for Cape York. We travel via the Hann River Roadhouse, and check out the Musgrave Telegraph Station. Musgrave was first built as an overland telegraph station in 1887, along with Palmerville, Fairview, Coen, Mein, Moreton, McDonnell and Paterson. It was named after Sir Anthony Musgrave (1828 - 1888) who was Governor of Queensland from 1883 to 1888. These stations were repeater stations, with great banks of batteries and a generator to boost the power in the telegraph line. We stop at the Lotus Lodge for morning tea. Beyond the township of Coen we pass the old Quarantine Station, and begin to pass a number of exciting creek crossings. We pass through the Mungkan Kandju National Park, a large wilderness park that stretches from the McIlwraith Range foothills, between the Archer and Coen rivers, and consists of open eucalypt woodlands, melaleuca swamps and various rainforest types. The Wik Mungkan, Kaanju and Ayapathu Aboriginal peoples, the Traditional Owners of the park, welcome you to their land and ask that you respect their culture and country during your visit. We take a break at the Archer River Roadhouse, and cross the Piccaninny Plains and Savannah country to arrive in Weipa for a tour of the massive bauxite mine operated by Rio Tinto. Weipa is the largest town on Cape York Peninsula, and has approx 3000 people supporting the mining and export of bauxite and cattle. Nearby is Duyfken Point, where Dutch explorer Willem Janszoon recorded the Australian coast in 1606, 164 years prior to James Cook. BLD Overnight Weipa

Day 3 - Depart Weipa to the OTT, crossing the Wenlock River. After a stop at the Moreton Telegraph Station, we turn off the OTT to the Bamaga Rd and enter the Jardine National Park and the Heathlands. Be entranced by the unusual change in the landscape. The Heathlands is a vast area of 2 metre high wet and dry heath vegetation which live side by side and is home to an abundance of wildlife. Enjoy a break at Eliot Falls before we cross the notorious Jardine River. We pass through the administrative centre for the region, Bamaga to Siesia, the "Gateway to the Torres Strait". Today we also travel on to the farthest northern point of Australia to stand on Australia's northern most tip, view the numerous islands of the Torres Strait, and the meeting place of the Arafura and Coral Seas. Overnight Siesia BLD

Day 4 - At 8 am depart by fast cat ferry for the 1 hour 10 min ride to Thursday Island, passing Friday and seeing Wednesday Islands enroute. Thursday Island is known as Waiben, meaning 'no water or place of no water'. In 1877, TI was an administrative centre for the Torres Strait Islands established by the Queensland Government. In the early days over 1000 Japanese pearl divers were operating here. In 1880, Thursday Island acted as the defence centre for Australia and old canons remain on the Island. On TI, a 1 hour island tour is included, highlighting local history and landmarks, then free time to enjoy the Torres Strait Islander cultural centre, and pearl, souvenir or window shopping. After lunch, (own cost) the return ferry departs at 2:30 from Engineers Wharf, arriving approximately 3:40. Enjoy free time this afternoon till dinner. Optionally, from Thursday Island your can join the Horn Island tour which visits WWII sites including a WWII museum. This tour also meets the last & only return ferry, and does not give time to look around Thursday Island. If you choose, you can overnight here and join us early next morning (additional cost) BD Overnight Siesia.

Day 5 - Heading south we visit the WWII aircraft wrecks of Bamaga, and skirt the Jardine River National Park, take the Jardine River crossing then a rest stop at Fruit Bat Falls. We visit the beach at Captain Billy's Landing located on the east coast, and arrive Archer River Roadhouse for refreshments, a few yarns and overnight.. BLD

Day 6 - Today we explore Lakefield National Park. The park is home to threatened species including the red goshawk, Lakeland Downs mouse and spectacled hare-wallaby. Hann and Kalpowar crossings are two of the many significant Aboriginal cultural sites found in the area. Barramundi abound here if you are feeling adventurous, and many waterbirds inhabit Low Lake. Enjoy this rich nature and great waterholes for swimming. Arrive Cooktown late afternoon for overnight. BLD

Day 7 - Cooktown to Cairns via the Bloomfield track & Daintree Rainforests. The Daintree Rainforest encompasses an area of approximately 1,200 square kilometres, from the Daintree River north to Cooktown and west to the Great Divide, representing the single largest block of tropical rainforest in Australia. The area protected under World Heritage listing covers an area of approximately 12,000 square kilometres, stretching from Townsville to Cooktown 75 per cent of which is tropical rainforest, an area equivalent to about the size of Sydney. We explore and discover the magic of rainforests on our Daintree Rainforest Discovery centre walk.

Cooktown was first established for the goldfields on the Palmer River in 1872, although its also famous for when Captain Cook repaired his ship, The Endeavour, after hitting coral on the Great Barrier Reef. We check out some key local landmarks, including the Vera Scarth-Johnson Gallery, whose artwork consists of illustrations of the flowering plants from the region, the Grassy Hill Lighthouse which is home to the Cooktown lighthouse, built in England and shipped to Cooktown in 1885, the sun dial which is actually a 'Global Positioning Monument' and Captain Cook's Grassy Hill Monument. Also, the James Cook Museum, including canon and the anchor from from Cooks ship, the HMS Bark Endeavour and Chinese, Pastoral, Mining, and Indigenous artefacts. We depart Cooktown via the coastal road (4WD only) and witness Black Mountain National Park, home to mysterious Aboriginal legends. We visit the heritage-listed Lions Den Hotel built in 1875, then spectacular Bloomfield Falls at the Bloomfield River crossing. This track was the site of many protests and the Daintree Blockade in 1983. The Bloomfield track takes us to Cape Tribulation and on to the ferry to cross the Daintree River. Time permitting, we travel through Mossman and visit Mossman Gorge, and a side trip via Port Douglas. Overnight Cairns. BLD

**Day 8** - Tour ends in Cairns after breakfast for flights home or join us to Darwin via the <u>Lost City, Undara Lava</u> <u>Tubes and Savannah Way Tour</u>

# **Lake Eyre**

Lake Eyre holds a number of records in Australia; It is the lowest point in Australia at 16m below sea level and when it fills it is the largest lake in Australia. Lake Eyre is located approximately 650km north of Adelaide, in South Australia.

Lake Eyre expands and contracts in size depending on the amount of local rain that falls in the basin but the periods of substantial growth occur when Lake Eyre is fed from flood waters coming from Queensland. The floods in Qld in early 2011 have fed the water system that leads to Lake Eyre resulting in it filling substantially and the desert is the greenest it has been in 30 years according to the locals.

Now is a great time to see Lake Eyre. It is experiencing one of the largest flood events for decades and this is encouraging enormous numbers of water birds back to region. Pelicans, swans, ducks, egrets, water hens and many more are now in great numbers at Cooper Creek. The Cooper Creek flood waters have crossed the Birdsville Track in the last few weeks, once again in 2011 on their way to Lake Eyre.

To allow you to fully appreciate the wonder of Lake Eyre, we can arrange a tour that includes a visit to the lake in one of our luxury 4WD vehicles where you can see the birdlife and some of the interesting features of the area. We can also take you to the skies for a flight over the lake which will show you the massive scale of the lake and the manner in which it is fed from the incoming rivers and flood plains.
