Day 1 – Pick up from your Sydney accommodation at 730 am and enjoy the fresh early light and air of the spectacular Blue Mountains. Visit Katoomba, Leura, Echo Point, Three Sisters, Jamieson Valley (Grand Canyon) and Cliff Drive over Megalong Valley before a morning tea at Govett's Leap near Blackheath, overlooking the Grosse Valley and spectacular Blue Gum Forest in the Blue Mountains. Option for descent into the Jamieson Valley via scenic railway and return by cable car – a great ride!

Beyond Govetts Leap we descent the 1500 metres of the **Great Dividing Range** to Lithgow and from Pearson's Lookout view the **Blue Mountains** region and **Wollomi National Park** in this **World Heritage** area. Enjoy a tasty lunch at a Winery in Mudgee and wine tasting. Often we see wild kangaroos as we travel these areas. Travel to the old **gold mining town**, and historic Gulgong, the town that was on the \$10 note. Overnight locally in a motel (twin /triple share or B&B - upgrades available) Choose your accommodation options when booking. Dine in town at the numerous options available (dinner own expense).

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
2 day NSW tours continued



Day 2: Depart for the awesome drive through the Goulburn River National Park and spectacular mountain passes to the village of Sandy Hollow (great arts and coffee stop) in the Hunter Valley. Travel through small rural town on the Golden Highway, via some of Australia's most prestigious thoroughbred horse studs, and cattle country. We see the vast coal mines of the Hunter Valley before our stop at some local wineries for wine tasting a full range of wines from various vineyards, and a delicious lunch. If willing, we can also visit the Hunter Valley Chocolate Company, a Cheese factory for cheese tasting and a fudge factory ... mmm. Wildlife are waiting for us at a nearby wildlife park (closed Wednesdays). Here we can take a close up look and see most of the famous Ozzie wild ones including koalas, kangaroos, wallabies, dingoes, wombats, echidnas and a great array of native birds. Sydney is a couple of hours away and we cross the mighty Hawkesbury River before travel through Sydney's leafy northern suburbs to arrive your hotel approx 6pm.

3 Day Sydney to Outback NSW Tour - itinerary

Day 1 - Depart your Sydney hotel or accommodation at 730 am and enjoy the fresh early light and air of the spectacular Blue Mountains. Visit Katoomba, Leura, Echo Point, Three Sisters, Jamieson Valley (Grand Canyon) and Cliff Drive over Megalong Valley before a morning tea at Govett's Leap near Blackheath, overlooking the Grosse Valley and spectacular Blue Gum Forest in the Blue Mountains.

Descent the 1500 metres of the Great Dividing Range and from Pearson's Lookout view the Blue Mountains region and Wollomi National Park in this World Heritage area. Enjoy a tasty lunch at a Winery in Mudgee and enjoy wine tasting. Travel on through old gold mining towns, and historic Gulgong - the town on the \$10 note. See wild kangaroos and emus as we travel through Warrumbungle National Park. Dine at own expense in town (numerous options) and consider a visit to the Sky Watch Observatory to view the night sky through their giant telescope. This area experiences some of the clearest skies in the world, hence the nearby Siding Springs Observatory. Enjoy motel style accommodation this evening.

Day 2: After a healthy breakfast travel through the Pilliga Scrub region on Backcountry dirt roads. Arrive Lightning Ridge, home to Australia's beautiful black opal. Visit an underground mine and see how the mining community lives. Buy your opals direct from the Opal Cutters and Wholesalers at huge discounts to City prices. Enjoy a swim in the healing waters of the hot Artesian spring baths. Overnight Lightning Ridge motel.

Day 3: Depart Lightning Ridge for the return journey to Sydney via huge sheep stations and some of the largest fields of wheat and cotton in the world. Witness the majestic 1520 m high Mt Kaputar dominating this ancient volcanic landscape. Visit Mt Kaputar foothills and see an ancient and massive organ pipe lava flow (time permitting). Lunch in a "Country Pub". Travel on through the Liverpool Ranges, and Scone, the heart of horse breeding country in Australia. Time permitting enjoy some wine tasting in the Hunter Valley before arrival in Sydney approximately 7:00 pm

Australian National Museum - Sydney - Melbourne Tour



Canberra Sydney Melbourne Tour

Day 1 - Sydney to Canberra

Take the Hume Highway south passing via the rich wool producing area of **Goulburn** and mysterious and disappearing **Lake George**, now with a very large working wind farm on the horizon. We arrive in the national capital, <u>Canberra</u>. This well-planned city was established in 1911 to create a capital for the newly federated country of Australia. Hidden beneath Canberra's leafy surrounds is a thriving modern city with national attractions that hold and share the treasures of the nation. At the <u>National Gallery of Australia</u> you can experience Australia through the eyes of our artists or visit the <u>National Museum of Australia</u> for a social history museum that explores the land, nation and people of Australia. The focus is on Indigenous histories and cultures, histories of European settlement and Australia's interaction with the environment.

Before leaving the <u>Canberra</u> region consider visiting a few vineyards. The region's cool climate wines are now receiving recognition worldwide. There are 140 vineyards with more than 35 cellar doors in peaceful rural countryside around <u>Canberra</u> and most are within 30 minutes of the city centre.



Thredbo Village Snowy Mountains Sydney Melbourne Tour

Day 2 - Canberra to Echuca via Thredbo & Snowy Mountains

Travel the **Monaro Highway** to Cooma, home of the Snowy Mountains Scheme that united the nation and redirected waters to the arid outback irrigation areas of the Murray & Murrumbidgee Rivers. Visit Australia's premier ski resort, Thredbo, and travel through "Man from Snowy River" highlands country via **Dead Horse Gap & The Alpine Way**. We follow the Murray River from Albury – Wodonga. European history in the area goes back over 180 years, when explorers Hume and Hovell crossed the Murray River in 1824. Gold fever, paddle steamers and railways all fuelled the development of <u>Albury-Wodonga</u> into a vital river port and customs point. Stroll through Albury's QEII Square visiting the Albury Regional Art Gallery to see works by well-known 20th century Australian artists or the Albury Regional Museum.

We travel west following the Murray River through the awesome and ancient outback **Barmah Forest** & take a little time to explore this iconic area. Upon arrival in <u>Echuca-Moama</u>, experience the first steaming of the paddle steamers and the fascinating wharf area.

Sydney - Melbourne - Sydney Outback Tours

Day 3 - Echuca to Melbourne

From Echuca, consider an optional paddle steamer cruise on the Murray River, which is the state border and an important past trade route. Arrive in the centre of Bendigo at the elaborate Alexandra Fountain. Discover the city's rich past with a day visiting attractions. Discover gold history at Central Deborah Gold Mine or wander through the historic streets admiring boom time architecture. More gold was found in Bendigo between 1850 and 1900 than anywhere else in the world. Today, art, culture, food, wine and heritage attractions are the new riches of Bendigo. The highway to Melbourne leads us past idyllic Mount Macedon and through Victoria's apple region Harcourt Valley. Arrive in Melbourne early evening.

Artesian Bore Baths

A trip to the Ridge would not be complete without a visit to the FREE Artesian Bore Baths. At the end of a hard day fossicking and exploring, there is nothing quite as therapeutic as a long soak in the naturally heated thermal baths. Allow the water to soothe your aches while you gaze at the starry night sky and enjoy the serenity. Bliss!

Astronomer's Monument

Take the time to browse this incredible feat of engineering and truly experience the eccentric mind of one of the Ridge's late characters. The walls of this 'concrete folly' have been carefully and lovingly inscribed and you can journey through the mind of its creator and wonder...

Not open to the public - but stop and have a look and read about the builder on the front gate. (On the red car door tour).

Black Queen

The Black Queen is true testament to the passion, dedication and hardship of the people of Lightning Ridge and is a living example of outback ingenuity. A series of three hand built sandstone cottages, the Black Queen is a stunning example of recycling at its best and 34 coloured bottle walls highlight the exquisite antique lamp display inside.
